### Arts Funding for 2023 (Arts Act 2003)

---

A subcommittee of Elected members met on December 12<sup>th</sup> 2022 to consider the recommendations of the Arts Office for Arts Grants 2022. Arts Grants are a Reserved Function of the Elected Members and some Councillors have through their participation in the Subcommittee over recent years made observations and requests in this year's Report.

The recommendations of the City Arts Officer for Arts Grants 2022 have been accepted with a request by the Subcommittee for a comprehensive review of Arts Grants focusing on the following questions

1. Are the available resources being allocated where they will have greatest impact?
2. How can there be a greater citywide distribution of Arts Grants?

The City Arts Office has agreed to the Review of Arts Grants requested and will bring the proposed parameters of this Review before the SPC early in 2022.

#### Arts Funding for 2020 (Arts Acts 2003)

In accordance with Section 6 of the Arts Act 2003 local authorities may provide financial assistance for the purpose of:

- (a) Stimulating public interest in the Arts,
- (b) Promoting knowledge, appreciation and practice of the arts, or
- (c) Improving standards in the arts within its functional area.

Dublin City Council advertised its Arts Grants & Bursary Scheme on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2022 with a closing date of 7<sup>th</sup> November 2022. A total of 128 x Grants and 70 x Bursaries applications were received and discussed with a Sub Group of the Arts, Culture, Leisure and Community SPC.

62 x Arts Grants were awarded of which there are 3 x categories

1. Project Grants: Applications by Artists, Arts Organisations and Collectives to mount specific projects such as plays, exhibitions, concerts etc. €100K
2. Voluntary and Neighbourhood Grants. €100k
3. Revenue Grants: Annual support for established Arts Organisations. €300k

10 x Bursaries were awarded €50k across 5 x categories:

The award of Grants & Bursaries to the total sum of €550,000 as detailed in the below reports, is recommended for approval by Dublin City Council.
