Arts Funding for 2024 (Arts Acts 2003)

In accordance with Section 6 of the Arts Act 2003 local authorities may provide financial assistance for the purpose of:

- (a) Stimulating public interest in the Arts,
- (b) Promoting knowledge, appreciation and practice of the arts, or
- (c) Improving standards in the arts within its functional area.

Dublin City Council advertised its Arts Grants and Bursary Scheme on 29th September 2023 with a closing date of 22nd November 2023. A total of 173 x Grants and 98 x Bursaries applications were received and discussed with a Sub Group of the Arts, Culture, Leisure and Community SPC. 272 applications were received across all categories (see below), a 38% increase on 2023.

58 x Arts Grants were awarded of which there are 3 x categories

1. Project Grants: Applications by Artists, Arts Organisations and Collectives to mount specific projects such as plays, exhibitions, concerts etc. €100K
2. Voluntary and Neighbourhood Grants. €100k
3. Revenue Grants: Annual support for established Arts Organisations. €300k
4. 12 x Bursaries were awarded €50k across 8 x categories

A subcommittee of elected members met on December 20th 2023 to consider the recommendations of the Arts Office for Arts Grants 2024. Arts Grants are a Reserved Function of the Elected Members.

The recommendations of the City Arts Officer for Arts Grants 2024 have been accepted by the Subcommittee. The award of Grants & Bursaries to the total sum of €550,000 as detailed in the below reports, is recommended for approval by Dublin City Council.

Additional funding for Arts Grants of €250K in 2024 will be allocated separately in a developmental process agreed by the SPC.
